Three Mo' Tenors To Headline Fundraiser
Concert to benefit Antioch Development Corporation

The Antioch Development Corporation will present Three Mo' Tenors on January 25, 2008 in the Allen Theater at Playhouse Square, 8:00 p.m. The world renowned trio will take to the stage in an unprecedented show that encompasses 400 years of music and seven genres. Conceived, directed and choreographed by Marion J. Caffey and produced by Willette Murphy Klausner, the acclaimed revue has been captivating audiences since 2001.

Inspired by the Jose Carreras, Placido Domingo and Luciano Pavarotti success in "The Three Tenors," the classically trained African-American singers have showcased their seamless blend of opera, Broadway, gospel, blues, jazz, soul and spirituals for audiences all over the world. The January performance will mark the conclusion of their four month Off-Broadway engagement at the Little Schubert Theatre in New York, NY. It has been nearly three years since Three Mo' Tenors performed in Cleveland and the first time in as many years they will lend their voices to help an organization raise awareness and money.

The Antioch Development Corporation is a 501(c)(3), non-profit organization dedicated to using faith and works to improve the quality of life for individuals and families residing, working, and worshipping in the Fairfax neighborhood and the Greater Cleveland community. The organization grew out of the outreach ministries of Antioch Baptist Church. They began providing social service programming in 1999 and incorporated under its current status in 2002.

Antioch Development Corporation currently operates four programs that seek to eliminate the debilitating health disparities and behavioral effects of generational poverty for children and adults:

- ***Agape*** - HIV/AIDS prevention, counseling and testing that serves over **1,000** adult individuals annually
- ***Stopping AIDS is My Mission (S.A.M.M.)*** – This HIV/AIDS youth prevention project has provided over **3,000** area high school students with valuable information and resources
- ***Genesis*** – A job training and placement program which has successfully employed over **300** participants
- ***Molding Minority Youth Through Faith and Mentoring (MY FAM)*** – An expanded career and character development enrichment initiative for at-risk middle school boys that has served over **250** youths as the Antioch Bridge the Gap program

“We are pleased to have the support of Cleveland Clinic, KeyBank, Hahn Loeser & Parks, LLP and Third Federal to bring Three Mo’ Tenors to Cleveland,” says Kelvin E. Berry, Executive Director, Antioch Development Corporation. “Our organization has been providing valuable social service programming for the Greater Cleveland community since 1999. However, many are unaware that our various initiatives are

under the Antioch Development Corporation umbrella. This concert provides us with a valuable opportunity to tell our story and those of the people we serve daily.”
